

2010 CENSUS POPULATION TOTALS RELEASED

On March 17, 2011, the U.S. Census Bureau released detailed 2010 Census population totals and demographic characteristics for the State of Georgia. These data provide the first look at population counts for small areas including race, Hispanic origin, voting age, and housing unit data from the 2010 Census.

The 2010 Census data show an overall increase of almost 31 percent in the population of Northeast Georgia between 2000 and 2010. During the same period, the population of the entire state increased by approximately 18 percent. According to the 2010 Census data, the vast majority of Northeast Georgia counties and municipalities experienced population growth between 2000 and 2010. Three Northeast Georgia counties (Barrow, Jackson, and Newton) experienced significant growth of at least 45 percent between 2000 and 2010. Four municipalities in Northeast Georgia (Between, Braselton, Jefferson, and Loganville) experienced explosive growth near or greater than 100 percent increases since the 2000 census.
