 - *i.* Maintenance of storm water outfall points is highly important at solid waste facilities and transfer stations.
 - *ii. Main Components for Site Compliance:*
 - 1. Inspect you site correctly and accordingly as dictated by updated EPD rules and regulations
 - 2. Maintain your SWPPP documentation
 - 3. Proper water sampling
 - 4. Making sure corrective measures for runoff are completed and documented
 - 5. Incorporate rule changes if required
